

Bison (Bison bonasus)

Issues: The largest land animal in Europe has disappeared from our fauna after more than 250 years.

Population: About 40-50 individuals living in captivity. Five of them were released in March 2012.

Outlook: Recent studies show that it is possible to create a large population in the Carpathian region with seamless between Ukraine, Poland and Slovakia.

Scavengers (Neophron percnopterus)

The issue: The numbers in the Balkans were halved between 2003 and 2011. Scavengers was declared a natural monument from the communist period, critically endangered in Romania and included in the Birds Directive.

Population: Throughout Europe have remained below 5000 pairs. Scavengers is in decline. They nestles in Romania. 1-2 copies appear periodically in Dobrogea.

Perspectives: An eventual recovery scavengers in Romania could be the first step for the other three species of vulture extinct in the twentieth century of our fauna.

Red-neck-goose (Branta rufficolis)

Issues: Policy environmental disaster in 1950 have altered the direction of bird migration in the Caspian Sea in winter.

Population: There are only 55,000 geese-the-neck-red worldwide. Almost 90% of them wintering in the coastal area of Romania and Bulgaria the north coast, in some places like Lake Techirghiol.

Outlook: The geese are affected by the construction and modification of coastal agricultural areas; hunters are often expelled (although banned from hunting) in feeding areas.

Issues: The largest snake in Romania exceptional specimens were found 2.5

Population: They have left only a few dozen individuals and species has been declared critically endangered on the red list of Romania.

Outlook: Although strictly protected and completely harmless, even useful for people dragon continue to be killed by locals.

Sturgeon (Huso Huso)

The issue: Now we have only a few thousand adults.

Population: Iron Gates Dam, Danube pollution, poaching and overfishing led to the disaster of the largest freshwater fish in Europe. Between 1992 and 2007, the beluga population declined by 93% globally. In Romania, commercial fishing was prohibited by law in 2006. The provision was raised through an Ordinance in 2009 and reintroduced in 2010

Outlook: The state spends million for restocking. Sturgeons in Romania is the last wild population in the Black Sea.

The issue: Discovered only in 1957, this single fossil species is endemic to Romania. It was thought extinct until a young individual was captured in 2011. Population: Pollution, dams on Arges gravel extraction have left in life probably under 100 copies.

Outlook: Valley Valsan was declared a endemite declared a natural monument, is critically endangered on the Red List of Romania and remain in a desperate

The-sand boa (Eryx jaculus)

The issue: In September 2011, a team of herpetologists from Oradea found near Turnu Magurele first-sand boa from 1986 onwards.

Population: Critically Endangered on the Red List, boa-de-sand is like disappeared in our country, which is the northern limit of habitat. Last population of Romania were probably destroyed with the construction of Danube-Black Sea Canal.

Outlook: It is threatened in other countries and could be reintroduced in our after breeding in captivity.

Lynx (Lynx lynx)

Issues: The lynx is the largest European cat. Although declared a natural monument in Romania is hunted every year (with exemptions from the law) because it would harm local communities

Population: Romania has most grated in the EU: about 1,300 individuals. In May 2012, the Environment Minister announced plans to suspend hunting derogations from lynx until 2014.

Outlook: Effective protection of lynx in the Carpathian would also provide protection of large areas of forest and many other species of livestock.

The stained-ferret (Vormela peregusna)

The issue: Romania is the only ferret populations in the European Union; only living species in arid and steppe.

Population: approximately individuals in Dobrogea.

Outlook: endangered species on the red list of Romania, ferret-stained protected about the ecology and status in our country.

European-mink (Mustela lutreola)

The issue: hunting and competition with American mink (escaped from fur farms) mink pushed to the brink.

Population: In the past, European mink was widespread; lived until recently including Maramures. Currently, in Romania still live up to 1000 European minks, exclusively in Delta - the last area of survival for the European mink, outside Russia.

Outlook: poaching and the decline continues

Population: In Romania, there are probably about 2,000 individuals (although recent data are not concrete).

Outlook: agricultural intensification and habitat destruction in Dobrogea is

Saker Falcon (Falco cherrug)

The issue: In the animal world is not threatened by any species, man is the only threat. Males are preferred by breeders hawks wich leads to an imbalance between the sexes in the wild population.

Population: European population of the species is very small and ranges between 360-540 pairs. A decreased significantly between 1970 - 1990, a trend that continued in the period 1990 - 2000.

Outlook: A conservation program of breeding populations in Hungary and Romania is currently carried out through a LIFE project.
